SYNOPSIS

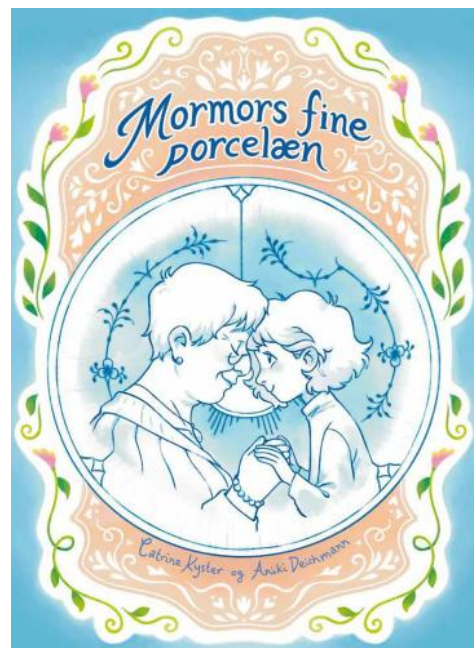
