SYNOPSIS

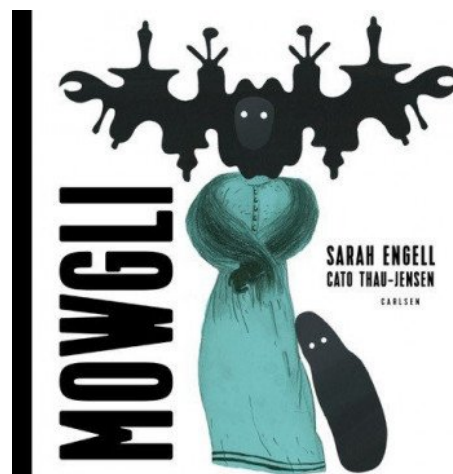
