Kitty Poo's mood is not made better by the fact that Ziggy has started making cat memes on his phone and can't be pulled away from the screen.

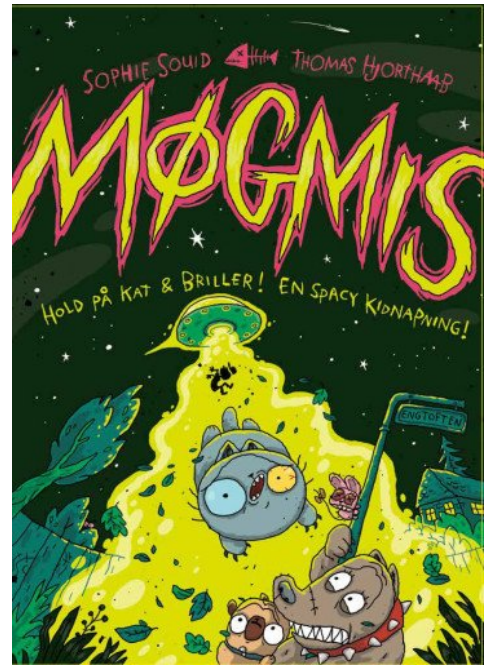
So to punish Ziggy - and get some attention - Kitty Poo decides to run away from home.

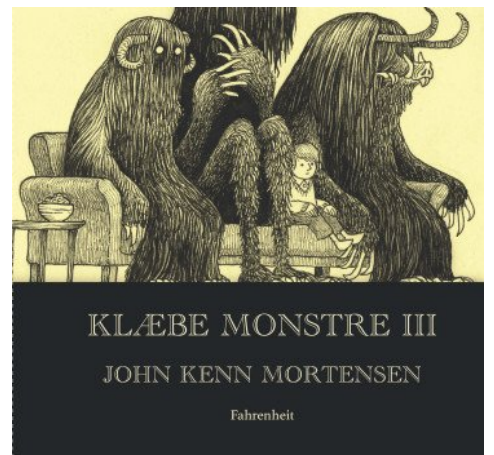
SYNOPSIS

John Kenn Mortensen has done it again! Drawn over 100 new monsters on post-it notes. It started in 2012 with STICKY MONSTERS and MORE STICKY MONSTERS. In STICKY MONSTERS III, each section on the book has a short text, such as "An open eye for love" or "Some books are never read to the end".

SYNOPSIS

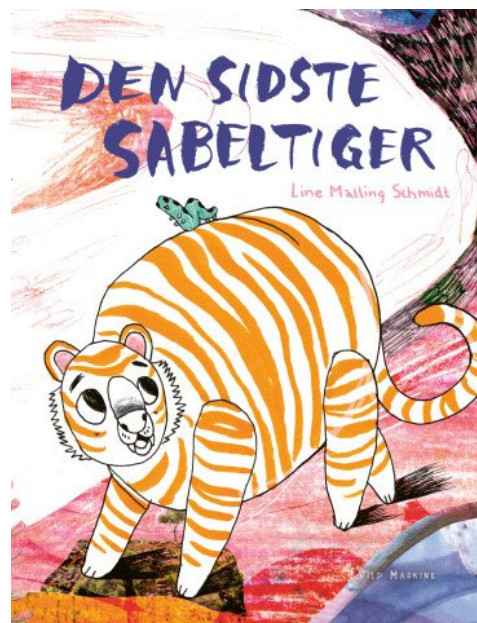

Luckily, it meets the caterpillar, who has a bright outlook on life and always has a cheeky quip. Together they set out to search for smilodon's relatives, even though the caterpillar has problems of its own.

Along the way, not just one, but two miracles happen.

Jeppe Sandholt (b. 1982) is a Danish animator and illustrator with a Bachelor of Arts in Character Animation from The Animation Workshop, Viborg, Denmark.

SYNOPSIS

Thor is a soft-spoken boy with an over-powering father. He is quite lonely and usually lets others take the lead. At school he is an easy target for the bullies. That all changes one day when he finds an eaglet, who is dependent on him to survive. Now, Thor gets to be in charge for a change. But eagles are not so easy to tame...

Winner of the Danish comic book prize, the Ping Prize 2024, in the category "Best children's book comic".

Nominated for the Nordic Council Children and Young People's Literature Prize 2025.

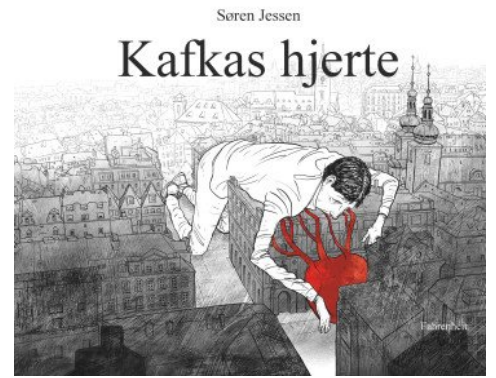
I wake up in the dark with the delightful sensation of a knife in my heart.

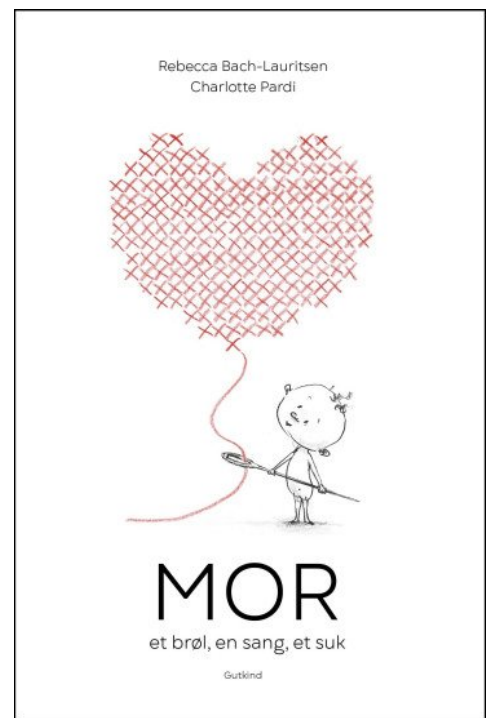
