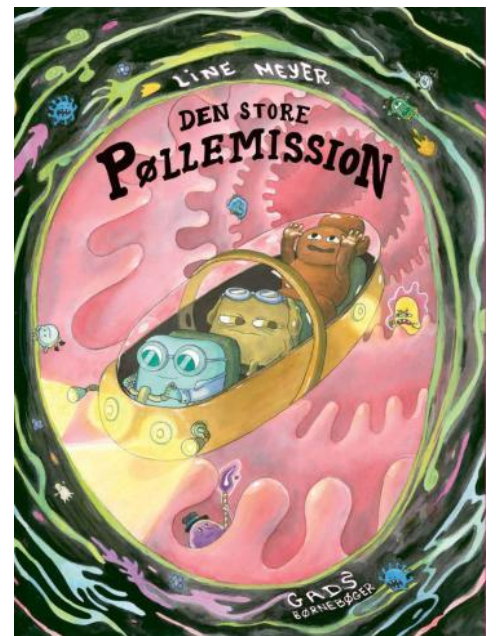
Line Meyer (b. 1989) is a graduate of the Academy of Fine Arts in Vienna and lives and works in Berlin.

SYNOPSIS

Explore the beautiful illustrations and learn in a fun way why farts are important for the body. This beautiful picture book can be read as a good story, but can also be used as a starting point for a conversation about the intestines and its functions.

In Professor Gutflora's intestinal system, everything is fine, but far away, in a foreign intestine, there are problems. The bacterial villain, Cliffo Diffo, has taken over. He spreads poison, and there are spore agents everywhere. Only one intestinal bacterium has survived - the brave Bifido Bifidum, but his powers are getting weaker and weaker.

Flora, Diarrhea Diana and Big Einar must travel to the foreign intestine, find Bifido and save the entire intestinal system. It will be their most dangerous mission ever.

This is the tenth book in the educational series about Max and Meta and their exploration of natural wonders.

Troels Gollander is one of Denmark's most popular writers of science literature for children and young adults,

Lars-Ole Nejstgaard is a cartoonist and illustrator of children's books, several of which have been adapted for film.

SYNOPSIS

In this book about Max and Meta, our two heroes go on a fantastic climate journey from North to South. During the story, they come through all four climate zones and thus experience both polar climates, temperate climates, subtropical climates and tropical climates. They also come to both very dry deserts and wet rainforests, and they not only learn more about seasons and climates, but also about why we humans should take care of the climate. Things also go a little wrong along the way in this educational story, but it of course ends well for Max and Meta and the quirky fly – and as always in the books about Max and Meta, children and adults learn something new, while having fun.

The books about Max and Meta are based on children's wonder at all the amazing things that surround us: colors, plants, the body, atoms, natural forces, celestial bodies and much more. The books in the series can be read aloud to children from 4-5 years old and read by the children themselves when they are a little older.

SYNOPSIS

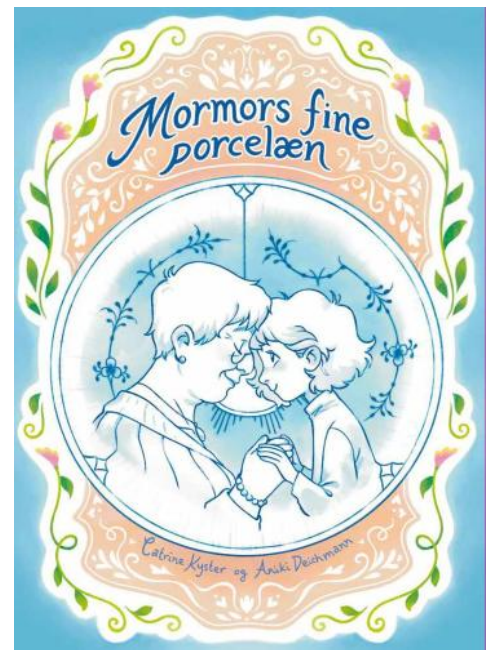

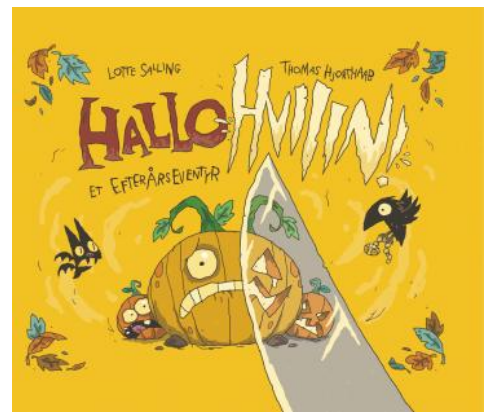
Hallowhiine!

SYNOPSIS

Come along on a journey of exploration through the child's first cell, meet the first animal that walked on land, and travel out into space to see our own galaxy from up above.

The Radionauts love to discover new things about our fascinating world and they need all the help they can get from curious children on their exploratory journey, racing through the body, entering down into the sewer, or finding mystical animals at the bottom of the deep sea.

The Radionauts are known from their popular Danish science podcast for children. Since 2016, children from 4-10 have been able to send scientific questions to the podcast and over the years more than 2000 questions arrived. Here is the list of some of the most popular topics that children ask about: 1. The Human Being, 2. Nature, 3. Technique, 4. Animals, 5. Culture, 6. The Universe.

You do not have to know about the podcast to read the book - it is an exploratory journey that any child around the world will be able to relate to. The book is beautifully illustrated through-out by Maria Buchmann.

Charlotte Pardi (b. 1971) has won the Danish Cultural Ministry's Illustrator Prize on several occasions and is loved for her gentle, appealing artwork.

SYNOPSIS

In this book, you'll meet seven of our great European philosophers... as children: Søren Kierkegaard, Immanuel Kant, Friedrich Nietzsche, Jean-Paul Sartre, René Descartes, Simone de Beauvoir and Niccolò Machiavelli.

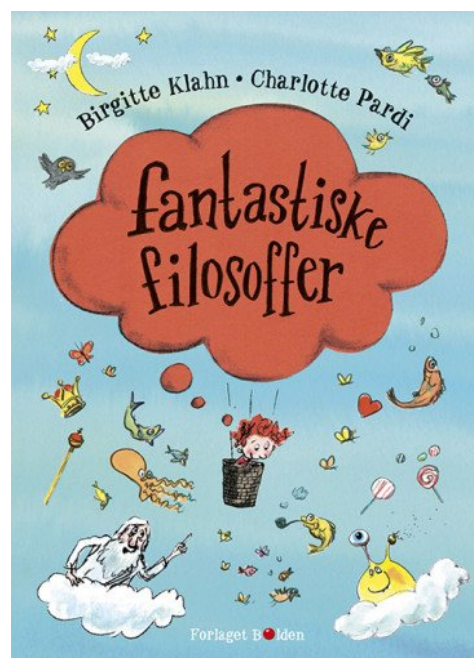
And in seven 'fictional' stories, built around each philosopher's childhood and youth, we see how their pondering, philosophising - and respective lead idea - emerge.

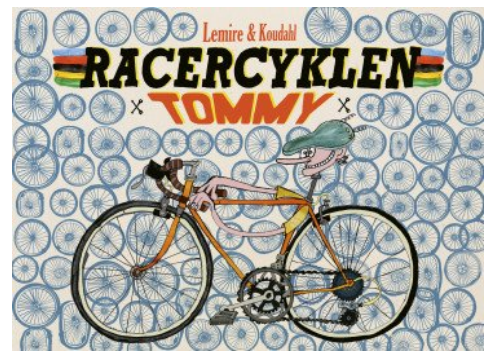

Medical doctor and clinical hypnotist, **Anne Knakkegaard**, uses her specialised knowledge to create bedtime books based on soothing hypnosis techniques.

Architect, **Julie Dam**, uses her full artistic palette to create the sweet illustrations in bedtime story books



SYNOPSIS

Through a series of stories, the child is encouraged to help the animals in the *Jungle Dreams* to find peace, so that both the child and the animals can fall asleep.

There are many reasons why the animal children have difficulty sleeping. The sloth, Susan, worries and ponders. The parrot, Petra, talks too much and isn't tired at all. The tapir, Tom, has a tummy ache and Lisa the Leafcutter Ant is afraid of the dark. Hank, the Howler Monkey has his head full of busy thoughts and Jason the Jaguar is struggling with growing pains.

The six stories in the *Jungle Dreams* are carefully developed and written so that the child can find help to deal with the most common problems connected with falling asleep.

In addition to the bedtime stories, the book offers hands-on advice and information on sleep, as well as tips on how to create the right atmosphere when reading aloud. The book is aimed at families with children aged 4-10 years.

In the home-market, the *Jungle Dreams* is available in App Store and Google Play where the stories can be played with soothing jungle music that continues after the story is over.

The mantra in this new optimistic climate book is "The more we know, the stronger we are". Climate journalist, Nina Bendixen, and child psychologist, Margrethe Brun Hansen, meet children age 9+ at their level and answer some of the big important questions that a lot of children concern themselves with.

Margrethe Brun Hansen is a psychologist with a speciality in child psychology. She is the author of several bestselling books and is a popular lecturer. On top of that, she is often interviewed for print media and has appeared on television on many occasions.

Nina Bendixen is a weather presenter on Danish national television and has her own radio program called "Crazy about Climate". She creates entertaining workshops for schools on climate topics and is "the climate nerd" on the national children's newspaper, *Børneavisen*.

SYNOPSIS

Nina Bendixen and Margrethe Brun Hansen calm out minds, helping us understand that Earth and nature are actually tough and survived some crazy events throughout history, coupled with the fact that a lot of climate measures are in place that will help us going forward.

They also answer a lot of questions that children posed themselves:

- Why don't we just plant a lot of trees?
- Why does CO2 exist if it is so bad?
- What happens with the sea, when it gets warmer?
- Why is a cow fart extra bad for the climate?
