Siri Melchior has already proved that her illustration style travels, her books having been published in Germany and Spain.

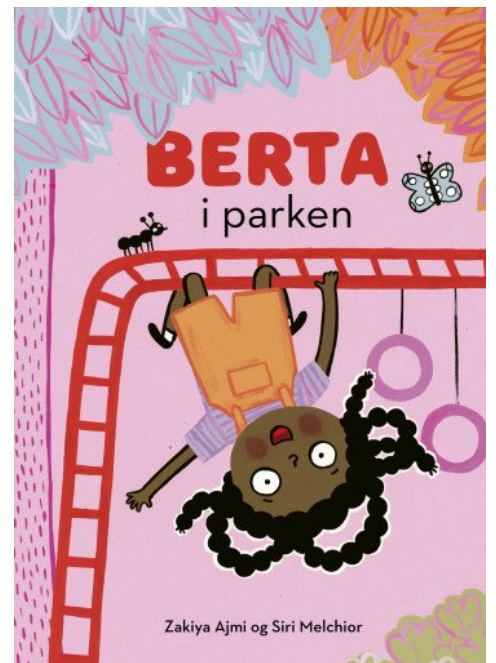

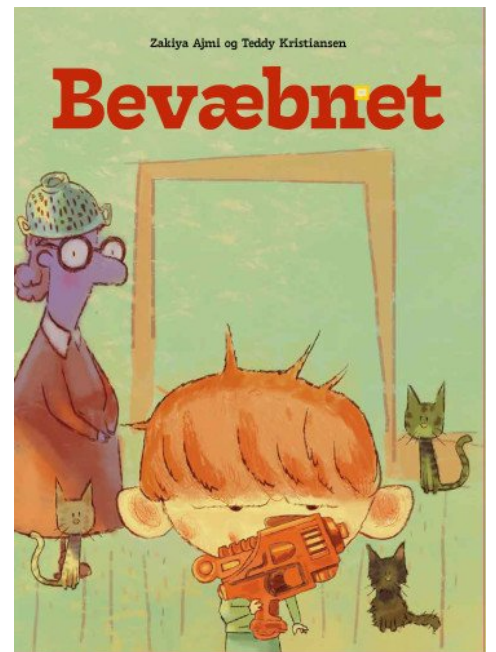

A Danish children's book classic, the picture book series now counts 8 books, as well as memory games and a cute teddy. The books are about emotions, something that never goes out of fashion. On the contrary, talking about emotions is more relevant now than ever before.

Dina Gellert (b. 1961) has drawn a wealth of children's books and her style is often described as happy, naive and humorous in the best senses of the words.

SYNOPSIS

Leopold is at Top Pig's birthday party. Top Pig gets lots of presents, but there is one in particular that makes Leopold very jealous. So jealous that he does something really stupid that he should never have done...

The stories about Leopold are humorous, and the language is subtle without any finger-pointing, even though the subject matter can be quite serious. It all takes place in a fun pig universe with lots of funny pig expressions. There's always a basis for a good laugh - for both children and their grown-ups - and a good chat about emotions!

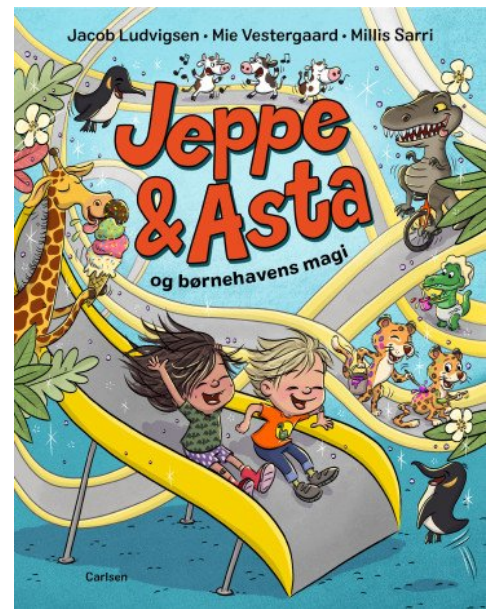

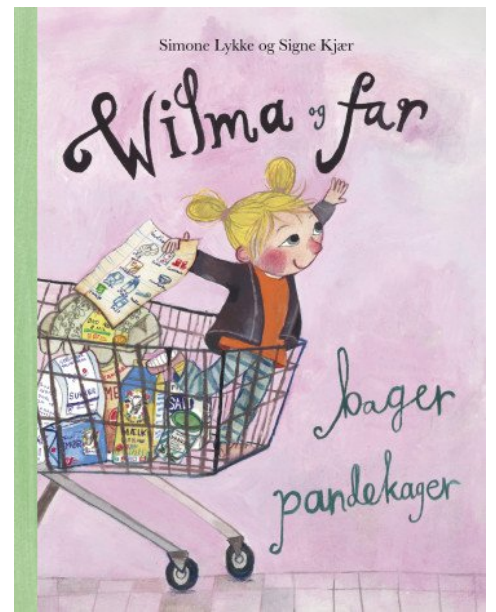

The text is rich in dialogue and the illustrations are full of fun details and side stories.

Kyle and Giraffe build a nice car from some old boards and wheels, 'You have to pull me first!' Kyle says and quickly jumps into the car.

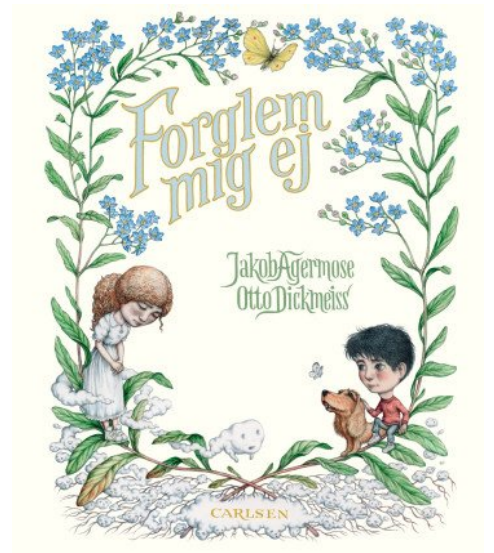

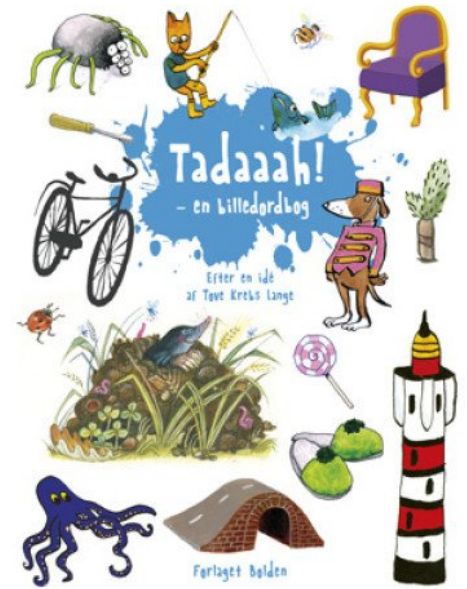

Visit the Wizard's workshop or Nose Land, ride the roller coaster in Unicorn Land and take a dip with the dogs at the Dog Hotel. Tadaaah is hiding in every post. Can you find him? He jumps from world to world through the 'holes' in the dictionary pages.

Zarah Juul is a popular Danish illustrator, known and loved for her original artwork and colourful style.



SYNOPSIS

The book invites you to spend many hours of cosy and educational experiences. The detailed world-spreads invite the child on an imaginative journey. After each world is a picture dictionary page with vignettes and words. By following Tadaaah, children will expand their vocabulary, both through the concrete picture words, but also through the dialogue on the otherwise wordless spreads, which encourages imaginative storytelling. At the back of the book there are fun puzzles to solve.

Thirteen Danish and German illustrators, led by Tove Krebs Lange, are behind the book. They have drawn inspiration from 2nd and 3rd grades in the border region. The book is available in two editions: a Danish-German picture dictionary with both Danish and German words for each vignette - and this Danish picture dictionary with Danish words.

Through her evocative illustrations, **Ane Bjørn** gives form to everything that children (and adults) sometimes find challenging to express with words: dreams, fears, sorrow, anger and imagination.

SYNOPSIS

If you close one eye and cover it with two fingers, you will get magic sight: this is the frame in which Ane Bjørn places her tale of a refugee family and a little girl's insistence to see the beauty of the world in the middle of its horrors.

In a nameless country, in a city in ruins, a girl learns something very special from her grandmother: By covering one eye with two fingers, you can see things, you otherwise don't have an eye for. Wonderful things, you didn't think existed. Golden castles in dark forests. Mermaids in the deep. Beauty, light and hope.

The perilous journey of the family towards a new place is told only through the visuals. The words on the other hand belong to the girl and loyally portray her subjective view of the world around her. A world that contrary to the harsh reality is full of colours and magic, light and hope.
